2021 Draft Class Formation. Message from Ms Manousaridis

All children have been tentatively placed in their 2021 classes on the basis of the enrolments we have received to date. This situation can obviously change as more families enrol at the beginning of the year. Please be advised that we cannot control enrolments and that we are required to enrol all local enrolments. Families can enrol throughout the year and this has the potential to impact on classes and class placement at any time.

We have a number of multi age classes given the composition of our enrolments which determine the school's staffing entitlements. The educational delivery is in no way compromised and in fact there is research which supports multi age classes as a beneficial mode of delivery.

All students will be advised of their teacher in 2021 and will have an opportunity to spend time with them at the end of this term. Parents will receive advice of their child's placement. We hope this transition process will assist children and families with managing the unknown during the summer break.

I want to reiterate that the basis of all our decisions is to provide the highest quality education in a safe and nurturing environment and that we teach children not classes. There are many factors we cannot control but we can control the approach we take and the attitude we adopt in managing

change and uncertainty. We have more than proven this in the past three years and especially in 2020.

The beginning of 2021 will herald some changes for our families and students. A local intake area adjustment (previously known as a boundary change) has been made affecting Wentworth Point and Victoria Avenue Public Schools.

to maintain this place. Or, if you prefer, you can enrol at your newly designated school, Victoria Avenue Public School.

Planning for Sydney Olympic Park new high school



Message from Principal Rose



It is hard to believe that this is the second last newsletter for this year. As usual it feels like we are all holding onto the tail of a tiger during these last few weeks as our workload increases dramatically in preparation for the coming year.

I would like to provide you with a broad overview of what we can expect in 2021.

2021-2024 School Improvement Plan

The school has almost completed its situational analysis which has required us to reflect on the School Excellence Framework and our External Validation which was completed in September as previously advised. The process has also required us to reflect on a range of external and internal school data, including research and literature to inform the development of our draft key focus areas and our three strategic directions. Our next step is to consult with our community and this will be done via a meeting with the P&C and a Zoom meeting (day and evening) where all parents are invited to join us.

Anticipated enrolments

We currently have 95 Kindergarten enrolments and we expect our enrolments in 2021 to continue to increase and this will be come more evident once the pandemic situation becomes more manageable. In light of this the school is expecting the installation of additional demountables to cater for our increasing enrolments. At this stage we are expecting about 560 students with about 24 classes not including our Support Unit classes.

Staffing

Our staffing will remain quite stable with most of our staff returning to work at Wentworth Point PS in 2021. A new Assistant Principal has been appointed and the officer will be announced next week. We are also expecting some new teachers. Our office staff will remain and we are expecting a new School Learning Support Officer in the Support Unit as Mrs Bugeja has accepted a transfer.

Bullying

I continue to hear the word bullying used both loosely and incorrectly by children and parents.

Bullying is defined by three key features:

- it involves a misuse of power in a relationship
- it is intentional, ongoing and repeated
- it involves behaviours that can cause harm.

Having a disagreement with a friend, or a single incident or argument is not defined as bullying. These behaviours may be upsetting, and should be resolved, but they are not bullying.

Physical and verbal bullying, such as kicking or name calling can be easy to see (overt). Other types of bullying, such as social exclusion or spreading rumours are not as easy to see (covert).

A person can be bullied about many different things such as how they look, sound or speak; their background, religion, race or culture including being Aboriginal; they have a disability; their sex; being lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex (LGBTI); their size or body shape; their schoolwork, hobbies or achievements; or other ways they may be different.

Bullying can also happen online using technology such as the internet or mobile devices. This is also called cyberbullying.
