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
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


#### SRC Fundraiser - Monday 16 December

## Strolling The Block

In Geography, Stage 1 were lucky enough to take a walk around the community. They were identifying community spaces and what they are used for. After being postponed due to weather, the students braved the heat and visited

the ferry, the library and had a trip through Marina Square. They had a great time and were very excited to be outside of school and share their experiences.

## Ramp Inventors

This term, the Hammerheads have been diving into the fascinating world of forces in Science, exploring how they make things move. This week's lesson was all about **gravity**—a force that keeps us grounded!

We pondered some big questions:

- How does gravity affect objects on Earth?
- Why do we stay upright?
- What happens when we jump, and why do we always come back down?

To investigate, the Hammerheads worked collaboratively in small groups to design ramps using classroom materials. Their mission: to demonstrate how gravity works and observe how the steepness of a ramp influences an object's speed and distance.


It was an exciting hands-on experiment! The students discovered that steeper ramps increase the force of gravity on an object, causing it to accelerate faster. Flatter ramps resulted in slower movement because less gravitational force acted on the object. When traveling uphill, objects had to work against gravity to move in the opposite direction.

The key takeaway? What goes up must come down! The Hammerheads loved testing their ideas and seeing science in action!

## EAL/D Network Meeting Sparks Insightful Discussion on the Role of Talk in Learning

Over 30 specialist teachers from the Strathfield teaching

network gathered for the latest EAL/D (English as an Additional Language or Dialect) Network meeting, hosted by Wentworth Point Public School. This key event provided an invaluable opportunity for teachers to network, share resources, and engage in reflective practice while participating in professional development.

The highlight of the meeting was a thought-provoking presentation by Margaret Turnbull, a Doctoral student at the University of Wollongong. Turnbull, an expert in the field of language and learning, shared her insights into the critical role of talk in the learning process. Drawing on foundational theories in education, she emphasised how language acquisition is intrinsically linked to the broader process of learning itself.

Margaret explained that much of the learning process happens through interaction, particularly through talk. Her presentation underscored the idea that talk is fundamental to both cognitive and social development, helping individuals make sense of their environments.

The session encouraged teachers to reflect on their own practices and how they might better support EAL/D learners by creating rich, interactive learning environments where talk is central to the educational experience. Teachers were also invited to share their own strategies and experiences, making the session a dynamic forum for professional exchange.
