Check In Assessment - Years 3-6

A reminder about our Check-in Assessments for Stage 2 (Years 3 and 4) and Stage 3 (Years 5 and 6) students. The Check-in assessment is an annual online assessment for students in Years 3 to 9 in NSW Public Schools. All students complete a readingtest and anumeracytest. Year 6 students also complete a writing task. Each test is designed to take up to 60 minutes, however, there is no time limit. Students are allowed extra time if required. Both the reading and numeracy tests have approximately 50 items (including a small number of items for trial purposes). The Year 6 writing task is a single prompt marked against а set criteria. The Check-in assessment supports the identification of students' performance in literacy and numeracy and informs next steps in teaching and learning. Students are required to bring in their own headphones to use during the assessment.

- Friday 13 September (9am-10:30am) Stage 2 Numeracy
- Monday 16 September Catch Up Session 1
- Thursday 19 September Catch Up Session 2

These assessments provide valuable insights into your child's learning and help us tailor our teaching to meet their needs. Please ensure that your child arrives at school on time and is well-rested on these days. If your child is unable to attend any of these sessions, the catch-up window on the 16th and 19th of September will be available. Thank you for your continued support in your child's education.

Teaching Time

This week in my teaching time with the Seahorses we looked at Phonemes and Graphemes. Our Learning Intention for this particular lesson was, 'We are learning to match graphemes (er/,/ar/, and /or/) to phonemes to help us read and spell words'. Students were engaged and ready to learn, contributing throughout the entire lesson verbally, on their mini whiteboards, and in their handwriting books. I can confidently say they achieved the Success Criteria, 'Students can confidently match graphemes with phonemes'. Students went on to consolidate their learning using Chromebooks.



Office Visits

One of the highlights of my day is being visited by students who want to show me their work. As a no awards, no rewards school, I hold off on the stickers and stamps, and instead celebrate their success with verbal praise. I encourage them to continue to strive for their best and help them build on their intrinsic motivation. Positive reinforcement goes a long way in reassuring students that they are achieving well. Achievement doesn't look the same for every student, and at WPPS we celebrate individual and personal growth. This week I was visited by Sophie and Lahann in Year 1. They were excited to show me their completed storyboards and how they translated the name of their favourite colour into Braile. They even knew how to say their favourite colour in Auslan – amazing!

Butterflies Count it Out



Butterflies have had a blast with numbers! Students built number towers with unifix cubes, matched numerals with dice and ten frames, and used playing cards to find pairs adding up to 10. The Butterflies created groups of 20 with various manipulatives and practised comparing their weights. Students also recorded combinations that add up to 10 using drawings and number sentences. These engaging activities made maths fun and educational, while developing counting, addition, and problem-solving skills!



Rainbowfish Dance Rehearsals

Rainbowfish have been working hard towards their end of term performance. We have been learning some pretty cool dance moves to perform to our chosen song. We love to dance and learn and our focus has been the elements of dance such as beat, rhythm and structure.

We have also been learning how to do sign language for our stage performance. Here is a sneak peak of us rehearsing. We have been having so much fun. We are so excited to be performing to all our friends and families in week 10.



The Belugas

The Belugas have been working so hard this term diving deep into the world of division and exploring the concept of sharing. They have been learning how to split items into equal groups through hands-on activities. This approach helps them grasp the foundational skills needed for even more complex math in the future. And it is such fun!

But that's not all! Our budding writers have also been exploring the creative side of language by crafting clever similes and metaphors. They have been using these literary tools to add colour and imagination to their writing, making their stories and descriptions more vivid and engaging. It's wonderful to see their confidence grow as they express their ideas in unique ways.

In music, the children have been exploring the power of the beat. They've been learning how rhythm can influence the mood and energy of a piece, and even create their

own rhythms to match different styles of music. We have had such fun!

I am so incredibly proud of their efforts and enthusiasm. It's a joy to watch them learn, laugh, and discover the wonders of both numbers and words! Be sure to ask your child to share their latest simile or division story with you.

Math in Action

Students are learning to identify the appropriate unit and device to measure distance and mass when solving problems. They used a variety of measuring devices to measure lengths and distances in different contexts, including perimeter. Students tried to come close to Tajay Gayle long jump 2020 Olympic record of 8.69 metres by using different techniques. The enjoyed estimating and measuring the length and width of different play areas in the school and find the perimeters.



Fun with Arrays!

The Funnel web had fun exploring arrays in a way that's easy to understand! We used colourful slides to show how arrays help with counting and simple multiplication. We got hands-on with counters, and I drew out the number patterns to make it super clear. The best part? The students had a blast practicing on their own and seeing how everything fits together.
